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Rebuild by Design (RBD) Social Resiliency Program Respondents Conference Call

GOSR held a conference call on Thursday, May 19th, 2016 from 2 pm- 3 pm to discuss the Rebuild by Design (RBD) Social Resiliency Program Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA). Questions asked during the call, and responses, are recorded below.

Question #1: Can respondents apply to portions of an RBD project, or must the submission respond to the entire scope of work described in the NOFA?

Answer #1: Submissions may respond to one or both RBD projects, and may respond to specific portions, sections or activities within an RBD project.

Question #2: What must be submitted by the respondent to indicate that it will be working with a partner to provide the services set out the submission?

Answer #2: A letter from the partner indicating a clear role and scope of support of the proposal can serve as evidence of partnerships. Further details can be addressed contractually once selections are made.

Question #3: Can potential respondents to the NOFA have access to the RFP that was released for planning and design work on the Living with the Bay project?

Answer #3: Yes.
