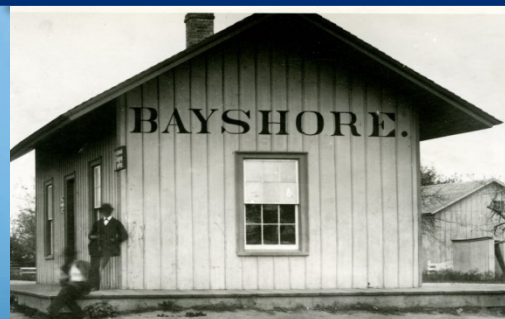

Our Focus is Long-Term Resiliency and Sustainability

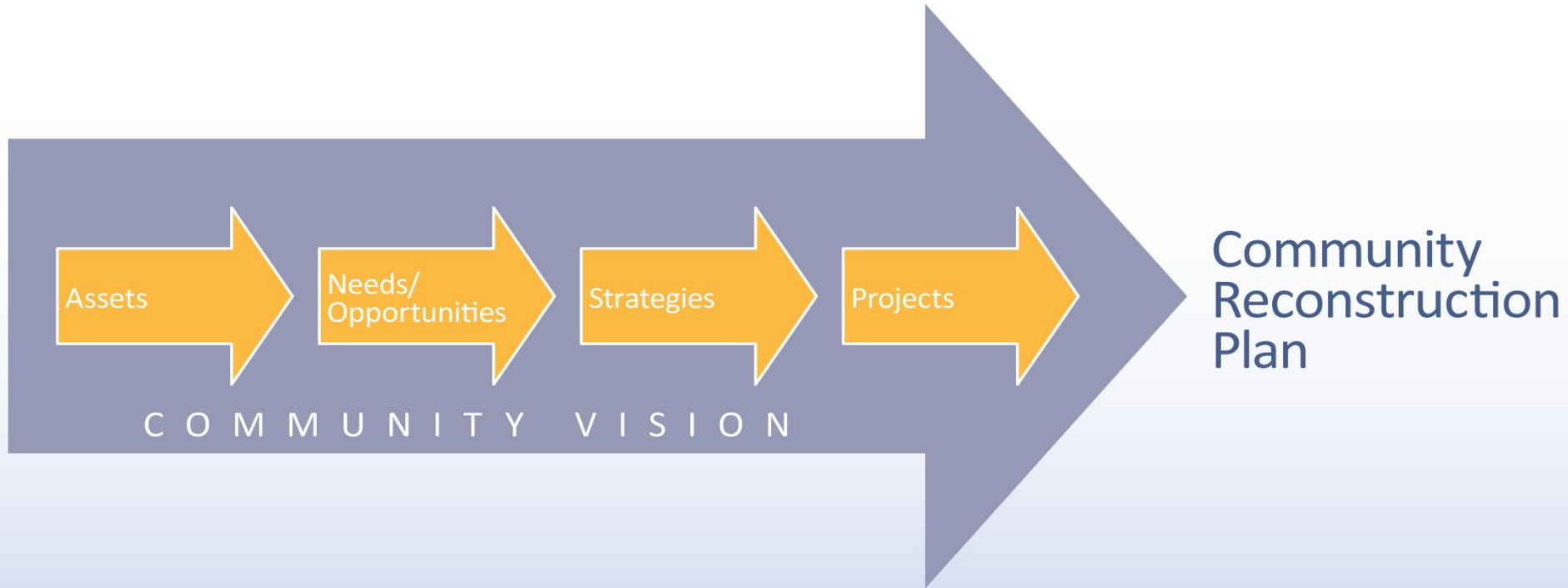

The Community Reconstruction Planning Process

Sample Vision Statement

Oakdale and West Sayville will be communities with a “greener” and more sustainable future with hazard resistant buildings and infrastructure and well-functioning natural systems that can prevent or minimize damage to life and property and the disruption of critical services. The rich history of the communities, the spectacular public and private spaces, emphasizing the importance of the health of our waterways and coastal proximity will guide future development with downtown identities which will focus on the essential character and charm of Oakdale and West Sayville.

Community Needs Pre & Post Storm

- Identify & prioritize assets
- Resiliency needs?

Community Planning and Capacity Building

Need:

Prevent personal injury and damage to property as well as impacts to emergency access and power from falling trees.

Opportunity:

Improve ability of homeowners and local businesses to maintain power during and after storm events.

Infrastructure

Need:

Mitigate repetitive flooding and protect provision of drainage.

Opportunity:

Improve shoreline protection and storm water drainage systems.



The Community Reconstruction Planning Process

Opportunities for Investment & Actions: Strategies

- Identify key strategies for resiliency
 - Infrastructure Systems
 - Housing
 - Community Planning & Capacity Building
 - Economic Development
 - Natural & Cultural Resources
 - Health & Social Services

Sample Strategy:

Ensure safe and reliable evacuation routes for both emergency personnel and the general public.



The Community Reconstruction Planning Process

Risk

- Risk is the chance that an asset will be damaged or destroyed.
- What assets are at risk?
- Risk assessment can provide the Community with a general sense of which assets are at greatest risk and where actions are needed to reduce future risk.

Featured Project: Make Docks More Resilient – Freight & Passenger Dock Repairs & Improvements (Phase 3 Construction)

Additional Resiliency Recommendation (ARR): Local Waterfront Revitalization Plan



Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG DR) Funding



Project/Actions implemented with this funding source must fall into:

- Federally-designated eligible activity category
- Fulfill national objective
 - Meeting urgent need
 - Removing slums & blight
 - Benefitting low to moderate income individuals
- Tie to the natural disaster to which funding is linked

Community is eligible for up to \$ 3 million in CDBG-DR funds
