
New York State assistance for rebuilding after Superstorm Sandy, Hurricane Irene, and Tropical Storm Lee

Five NY Rising Round II communities in New York City

Community-driven planning process to produce a Final Plan by December 2014

Project implementation to follow, funded through CDBG-DR and other sources

Southeast Brooklyn Waterfront has been allocated \$4.38 million in CDBG-DR funding






Strategy: Leverage **existing assets** to stabilize the coastal edge and reduce flooding

Strategy: Make the power supply more resilient and redundant


