

# Current Draft Vision Statement



# Needs and Opportunities

Needs and Opportunities - immediate, short, mid and long term

- Community Planning and Capacity Building
  - Need for public education?
  - Are current laws/regulations/plans inclusive of socioeconomic, demographic, risk assessment and vulnerable populations?
  - How will Stony Point implement storm recovery and plan to mitigate future impacts?
- Economic Development
  - See EPA Technical Assistance for Sustainable Communities Report
- Health and Social Services
  - How have public health, health care facilities and essential social services been disrupted/restored?
  - What is needed to assist those affected?

# Needs and Opportunities

- Housing
  - What housing stock was damaged/destroyed by recent storms?
  - What are the housing needs in the community?
- Infrastructure
  - Is there a need for repair, redevelopment or relocation of infrastructure?
  - What can be done to make existing infrastructure more resilient?
- Natural and Cultural Resources
  - What resources were damaged?
  - How can assets (i.e. Wetlands, bulkheads) be restored/rebuilt/enhanced?


## Rockland County Town of Stony Point Needs and Opportunities

### FEMA Flood Zones ZONE

- A - Areas with a 1% annual chance of flooding and a 26% chance of flooding over the life of a 30-year mortgage.
- Shaded X - Area of moderate flood hazard, usually the area between the limits of the 100-year and 500-year floods.
- V - Coastal areas with a 1% or greater chance of flooding and an additional hazard associated with storm waves.
